

#### K-6 LINE COLLABORATION INSTILLATION


Non objective artwork, is when an artist uses line, shape and color to create an idea in any medium. We discussed the non objective painting, Maquillage, 1913 by Russian painter, Natalya Goncharova. Every class looked at the painting for 30 seconds and see if they can find something other people may not notice.

Why do you see something different? We all have a different point of view, because we all have different experiences, families, and homes.

Why do you think it's important to share your point of view? Your idea could help someone be understanding to your perspective. Also putting points of view together can create one big fantastic idea.

So, that is what we did. We shared what we found in the painting, and used lines and one color to create unity in a collaborative instillation.


All students K-6 donated their line design to the sculpture board to help beautify our school, and share their perspective of lines. Check out our collaborative instillation, pictured on the right.


