





K-6 LINE COLLABORATION INSTILLATION


Non objective artwork, is when an artist uses line, shape and color to create an idea in any medium. We discussed the non objective painting, Maquillage, 1913 by Russian painter, Natalya Goncharova. Every class looked at the painting for 30 seconds and see if they can find something other people may not notice.

Why do you see something different? We all have a different point of view, because we all have different experiences, families, and homes.

Why do you think it's important to share your point of view? Your idea could help someone be understanding to your perspective. Also putting points of view together can create one big fantastic idea.

So, that is what we did. We shared what we found in the painting, and used lines and one color to create unity in a collaborative instillation.



REQUIRED DOCUMENTS to SIGN-UP / APPLY

- 1.) PHOTO ID: for Head of Household (person applying)
- 2.) PROOF OF AGES FOR CHILDREN: (must have at least 1 child age 14 or under in the household to be eligible) Birth Certificates; OR Current Medicaid Card (with DOB); OR School Enrollment forms
- 3.) PROOF OF ADDRESS: (dated within the last 30 days & must live in Sarpy County): Utility bill (OPPD, MUD, Black Hills Energy) - preferred; OR Letter from NE- DHHS
- 4.) PROOF OF TOTAL HOUSEHOLD INCOME: Pay stubs for last 30 days; OR Social Security 2023 Benefits Letter; OR, Unemployment letter, or NE-DHHS Economic Assistance/Medicaid eligibility letter.
